Your photo stream is popular. So much so that you've decided to start a second Instagram account. But how will you manage them? On your smartphone, you have the option of installing multiple client apps, but what can you do to manage multiple Instagram accounts on your desktop? Instagram website: Not for Instagram desktops on your phone: it's easy to use, is it? In the app, you can browse channels, take pictures, add filters, and upload them while tagging friends and adding images to other social networks. Inexplicably, the same is not true on your desktop computer. You can't even sign up for the service, nor upload a photo through the Instagram website, which seems optimized solely for displaying image galleries. We're happy to announce that there's a way that you can upload images from your desktop or laptop to Instagram, however. This requires a piece of software called BlueStacks, which is essentially an Android emulator. We've featured it a few times previously on MakeUseOf, and BlueStacks is just one of the most useful pieces of software to maintain the Android experience on Windows XP and then, and on Mac OS OS X. You can get a copy of BlueStacks, a free app from www.BlueStacks.com. Please note that this is incompatible with some antivirus/Internet security software such as Bitdefender Internet Security 2015. With BlueStacks, you can run Android apps on your desktop or laptop. As Instagram has an Android app, you can probably see where we go with this... Improving access to Instagram on your computer with BlueStacks We previously reviewed the BlueStacks installation here at MakeUseOf, so would encourage you to check out the relevant article to find out more about it. Here's a review: With BlueStacks set up, it's time to install Instagram, which you can do by visiting Google Play by entering your preferred Google account details. Once installed, log on to Instagram and you can start sharing your photos! How do I get photos from my phone to my computer? In due course the best way is through cloud storage services such as Dropbox or Google Drive, which should be configured on your phone and on installing BlueStacks on your computer. However, you can now simply copy the hard drive data to BlueStacks using all the apps of the Gt; BlueStacks Settings Windows Files, after which you have to view the files you want to access in BlueStacks. From now on, uploading a photo or video clip to Instagram (you can upload clips that you edited on your desktop) is as simple as clicking the camera icon, viewing photos and selecting the image you want to upload with the usual description, tag and choice Networks. There's a good chance that your computer or tablet webcam won't be compatible with BlueStacks, however, so make sure that whatever you want to snap using this is done from inside your master operating system. Any app you install through BlueStacks will create 8 Start screen tiles that can be very useful for opening an app or game in question without opening BlueStacks in the first place! Instagram Installed: Time to use it! With Instagram installed on BlueStacks, you can use the app to create a new account, or log in and use it just like you would an Android app - because that's what it is! Use your mouse (preferably even if you're using a Windows tablet) click Sign up and follow account instructions. If you're signing up for an existing account, it should be clear how to do it. One of the best things about BlueStacks is that it provides pop-up messages outside of the App for Alerts and Notifications in Android, although that's what you need to include during the installation phase. This means that you can not only run Instagram on your computer, you can also get pop-up notifications thanks to BlueStacks! Whenever someone follows you or likes or comments on an image you have uploaded, you get a notification. Use the Instagram Settings menu to set up the display of these notifications. Instagram or Instwogram? While launching Instagram's mobile app blueStacks is a solution to uploading images from your desktop, you may well have multiple accounts. You may find that running one account on your phone and the other on your computer is good enough, but there's a good chance that it's not. The best solution for processing multiple Instagram accounts on Android is to install Instwogram, which acts as the second Instagram app. By a surprising coincidence, this is another application that we previously reviewed on MakeUseOf. To install it on BlueStacks, download the Instwogram APK file to your computer and double-click. This will result in it being automatically installed in BlueStacks, from where you can run, log in and start uploading images! Own Chromebook? No BlueStacks needed! In case you have a Chromebook, you'll be glad to know that BlueStacks is not required to access Instagram. While it would be great to have an Instagram app for Chromebooks, the best option at the moment is to launch the Instagram app in the Chrome browser. Several ways to run Android apps have been created in this way, both of which can be a little uncomfortable. If you can handle getting your fingers dirty with email files, then try one of these methods to run Android APK files in the Chrome browser. Multiple Instagram accounts? Try it! Whether you have special Instagram accounts for you and your dogs, or you're in charge of social media for your employer, there are many reasons why you may have a few Instagram. Unlike Facebook and Twitter it's just not easy to access multiple Instagram accounts, and when you factor in how limited the desktop interface is on the social network, you'll realize that using stacks, perhaps with the Instwogram app, is the best option. A good move - especially if you post content that you don't want to be viewed by a specific person or group of people who can go looking for you on Instagram. Here are the steps to do this, as explained using the iPhone's Instagram app: Tap the profile icon in the bottom right corner of the screen and then tap the menu icon in the top right corner. Click The Privacy Settings. Lifewire Click Privacy Account then click next to a private account. Lifewire If it's not your entire profile you want to make private, but with only a few photos, you also have the option to hide some photos on your Instagram account. The option is in the photo menu. You've successfully set your Instagram profile on a private one. (There's no need to save the settings changes.) As long as you have that private account option, only users who are currently following you, as well as any new users you approve of if they ask to follow you, will be able to see your Instagram content. We answer some of the most common questions people ask about their Instagram privacy: What if I tag a user or add a hashtag to one of my Instagram posts when my profile is profiled? Can people still see it? Only users who follow you will be able to see it. Tagging other users who don't follow you or putting a hashtag in the description doesn't negate the privacy of the post. It won't be seen by anyone who doesn't follow you already. What if I want to share an Instagram post on other social networking sites when my profile is published privately? If you choose to share a post on Facebook, Twitter, Tumblr, Flickr or other social networks, it will be public to view as a standalone post. Anyone viewing will be able to click on Instagram permalink to view it in its entirety, but if they click on your username to view your full profile, they won't be able to see your other content if they don't follow you already. If someone decides to follow me while my profile is private, will they be able to see my posts? Not until you approve them. When one user clicks the Follow button on a user whose profile is private, they only send a message with a follow-up request. that if you receive a follow-up request from someone, they won't be able to see any of your content until you manually approve their request to follow you. Someone's following me, but I don't want him or her to be a follower anymore. How to get rid of this man? To stop someone from following you, block your account. Open View Click on the three white circles in the top right corner and click Block User to remove this account from your subscribers. (You can also report the account.) Can I set up my profile privately while Instagram.com online? Yes, you can do this from the privacy and security of Instagram settings. How often can I switch between public and private? There doesn't seem to be a limit to how often you turn your privacy settings on or off, so if you feel like doing it several times a day, this shouldn't be a problem. This flexibility may change because Instagram sets limits on other forms of activity. Will I lose my followers if I make my profile private? No. You won't lose any of the followers you have now and everyone will have full access to everything you post. Can I make my Instagram business account private? No. You'll have to turn it into a personal Instagram account. Account.
